Carl Mangus Appel

Carl was born in Sweden about 1805. It is thought that the original name was Manguson (common Swedish naming practice would mean is son of Mangus). It was a common practice for men to adopt less common name when entering the military. His marriage to Eva is recorded in the Säby, Jonkopings, Sweden church records on the 25th of October in 1830. although no record of his immigration is found, it is mentioned in a later article in Wisconsin that he immigrated with his son in 1872 coming first to Menominee, Michigan

From History of Door County, WI. The County Beautiful By Hjalmar R. Holand MA we find the following information (In the previous paragraph we know the period is approximately 1870)

With the opening of Shipping facilities at Sister Bay, there was a great demand for woodchoppers in the forest of Liberty Grove. A great many Swedes came over from Marinette to fill this want. As land was very cheap, many of them bought land and stayed to become substantial farmers. Among these were Charles Appel Sr. with his sons Axel, Charles and Sanders. August Kellstrom, Fred Dahlstrom, Sven Hilander, Henry Larson, Louis Peterson, and John Evenson. There were however scores of other who came only to cut wood and having no faith in farming, faded away to other slashing. They were big strapping fellows, chopping wood fall to fall often making four cords per day, drinking, fighting and eating what they liked.

By 1880 Carl has left Door county as he does not appear in the 1880 census. There is a record of his wife Eva immigrating in 1881 to Chicago in both the Sweedish departures records and in the Sister Bay Moravian Chrch records. It is assumed that in 1880 he had relocated to Chicago, Illinois and it is in Chicago that his death is recorded on January 14 1890.

Eva Sarah Swensen

Eva Sarah Swenson was born February 27, 1815 in Sweden, to parents unknown to us at this time. The place of her birth and youth are also unknown. She married Carl Mangus Appel on October 25 1830. From the From Ephraim/Sister Bay Register 1886-1919 Moravian Church, we know that she was the mother of 7 children of which we have records of five. August Appel was born about 1844, Mathilda was born on November 2 1847, John Appel about 1851. Axel Appel on May 27, 1852. Charles Appel was born on January 15 1856. All of the children were born in Sweden. The two additional children were probably born prior to 1844 and did not immigrate to the United States.

Carl the father and August, Axel and Charles (sons) all immigrated to the Michigan and finally to Wisconsin in 1871. Eva remained in Sweden till she immigrated to this county in 1881. We do find the record of her immigration in the Emigranten Popular on August 12 1881 She left Goteborg Sweden for Chicago Ill. It notes in the same register that she then located to Sister Bay, living with her daughter Mathilda Peterson.

Eva Appel died at the home of her daughter Mathilda Peterson on February 18, 1900 at the age of 83 years, 11 months and 18 days with the primary cause listed as old age. She is buried on February 22, 1900 at the Moravian Cemetery in Sister Bay Wisconsin and her death is recorded in the Door County Registration of Death.

Axel Appel

Axel's birth is recorded in the Swedish church records of Säby, Jonkopings, Sweden as May 27th 1852. He is the son of Carl Mangus Appel and Eva Sara Swensen (Samueldattr). Säby is located on the western shore of Lake Sabysjon, south, southwest of Tranas Sweden at the intersection of Route 32 and 133. It is a crossroad with a church. We know that he departed from Göteborg aboard the ship Orlando December 6 1872 for Marinett in Michigan .After staying in Michigan for approximately a year, the relocated to Liberty Grove, Door County in Wisconsin as there was a great need for lumberman there. He was with his father Charles and brothers Charles and Sanders.

While in Liberty Grove he originally was lumberman as time went on he put down roots. On July 13, 1878 he is noted as a charter member of the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Church now called the Zion Lutheran Church of Sister Bay. On December 31 1879, the eve of a new year he was married to Lourine Christine Kofoed at Fish Creek by John J. Groenfeldt, the minister of the Moravian Church in Ephraim. He became a naturalized citizen in 1880. In 1883 after petitioning the state government he built a dock and store at the end of the present Appleport road. The pier is mentioned in an article from the Milwaukee Sentinel on April 25 1883. It says the dock will be 1000 feet long. From here he shipped cordwood to Chicago. Later he sold the dock and store to Captain HA Porth in September 1884. Axel then did some faming on the present Sunstrom farm on County road 22 in Liberty Grove. In 1895 he sold the farm to the Sumstoms and moved to Chicago. This move was in hope that the doctors in Chicago would be able to help Laura with a sickness that she had. However on July 17 1895 she passed away despite the doctors efforts.

In 1895 we find Axel is living at 847 East Chicago and is listed as a driver. The area was where many Sweeds were settled. On April 24 1899 he married Emily Gustafsen Appel in Kenosha Wisconsin. She was the wife of his deceased brother John. He also took on the responsibility of raising two additional children Cora and Harry. He was working as a motorman on the street railroad through the 1930 census. They lived in a number of rental houses prior to buying a house at 630 South Cuyler Street in Oak Park, Ill. in 1930 he is listed as owning a radio.

Axel dies on May 28, 1934 and is buried in Rosehill Cemetery, section 188, lot 212 in Chicago. He was a member of I Will Lodge No 141, I.O.O.F. (Oddfellows) Local Union 241 and Humboldt Tent No. 26 K.O.T.M. (Knights of Maccabees Fraternal Humboldt Tent)
