Charles E. Jost

Charles Jost was born on February 25, 1854 in Columbia Illinois. He was the second child and first son of John Jost and Barbara (Volaufer) Jost. He spent his early life in Columbia and attended school for some years as noted in the 1860 Census. Later by 1870 census he is a blacksmith apprentice working in his father shop.

By the time of the 1880 census the family had relocated to 2315 Chouteau Ave in St. Louis where his father has a Sattler Shop and he is working as a blacksmith.

On January 1, 1881 Charles is married to Augusta Emilie Hallbauer. The marriage is noted in the Missouri Marriage Records. The witnesses were Albert Beal and Henrietta Immer. J. G. Eberhard the pastor of the Independent Evangelical Protestant Church of the Holy Ghost, a German Evangelical Church Located at 8th and Washington officiated at the wedding. We can assume that either the bride or the groom or both attended service there.

Charles Jost started as a blacksmith in his father's shop on Chouteau Ave. He latter had his own Shop, also on Chouteau where he specialized in carriage and wagon making. The family lived part of the time in the residence at the rear of the shop and for a number of years in the 1890 at 3103 Rutger in St. Louis. By 1900 they are again living in the residence in the rear of the shop and lives there through about 1915. The 1920 census find him living in the home of his daughter Bertha Hahne at 2615 Caroline Street.

In the 1900 Census we find John and Augusta living at 2721 R Chouteau Avenue, the residence was in the rear of his shop. The shop was a blacksmith shop and he also mage wagon and carriages. They have been married for 19 years and they have had 8 children which are all living. It also noted that he can read, write and speak English. The shop and home are rented.

In the 1910 Census, Charles is 56 and He and Augusta have been married for 29 years. He is listed as a wagon maker and living at 2723 Chouteau with the business at 2721 Chouteau. It notes that he owns the shop and is an employer. Five children from the age of 10 to 21 are living with them.

Charles dies from Gallstones on January 16 1922 and was cremated and his ashes lay in Valhalla Hillcrest Abbey in the Abbey Annex in St, Louis MO.

Augusta Emilie Hallbauer

Augusta Emilie Hallbauer was born January 15 1861 in St. Louis Missouri. She was the fourth child and

third daughter of Charles and Anna Sophia (Schloo) Hallbauer. There is no record of her birth. The 1870 census find her 7 years old, living with her father and attending school, her mother having passed away in 1869. In the 1880 census Augusta, 17 is living with her married sister Emma Huhn at 2311 Chouteau Ave. Only two doors away at 2315 her future husband Charles is working in his father's blacksmith shop so it is probable that they met because they were neighbors.

On January 1 1881 Charles is married to Augusta Emilie Hallbauer. The marriage is noted in the Missouri Marriage Records. The witnesses were Albert Beal and Henrietta Immer. The marriage was officiated by J. G. Eberhard, the pastor of the Independent Evangelical Protestant Church of the Holy Ghost. (German Evangelical Church) Located at 8th and Washington. We can assume that either the bride or the groom or both attended service there.

In the 1900 Census we find John and Augusta living at 2721 R Chouteau Avenue, the residence was in the rear of his shop. The shop was a blacksmith shop and he also made wagon and carriages. She has been married for 19 years and has had 8 children which are all living. It notes that both of her parents were born in Germany and that she can read, write and speak English.

The 1910 census find Augusta and Charles living at 2723 Chouteau Avenue. After 29 years of marriage, she has had 13 children but only 8 are still living.

The 1920 census find Augusta and Charles living at 2615 2 rear Caroline Street. One daughter Heniretta is still living with them. Charles dies in 1922.

In the 1930 census find Augusta living at 1631 Texas Street with daughter Heniretta who is married to Fred Sturgess.

By 1940 she is living at 7017 Idlewild Street in Jennings.

Augusta died September 6 1941 at 3 PM of a stroke caused by hardening of the arteries and was cremated at the Missouri Crematory. Her ashes are in Valhalla Hillcrest, St, Louis County Mo.

Ferdinan Jost

It should be noted here that per V. L. Appel, son Ferdinan was for many years a tile setter at The New St. Louis Cathedral and was helped produce some of the mosaics that the church is famous for.

John Jost

John was for many years a sign painter.

Lena Barbara Jost

Lena Barbara Jost was born on July 18th 1889 as noted in the Missouri records of Births. She was the fifth child and first daughter of Charles Jost and Augusta Emilie Hallbauer Jost. The family was living at 3103 Rutger in South St. Louis MO. In the 1900 Census she is listed at school so we know that she did complete some education. In the 1910 census she is listed as a shirt ironer and she worked at one time at Banner laundry. On Monday November 4 1912 she was discharged from the laundry. She and several of the other girls were unhappy with working conditions and were going to ask for changes. She was appointed first spokes woman. After she spoke the others chose not to and she alone was fired. On Wednesday evening April 12 she met Tony Pointer the man she was to marry.

They were married on June 25 1913 and the Marriage license is noted in the June 26th 1913 Post Dispatch and were living on 2550 Lafayette St. in St. Louis. She had five children and most of her life was devoted to raising them. They lived in a number of places in St. Louis, Jennings and finally spending many years on Gerling Place in Overland. Lena dies in February 26 1967 after a brief illness. She was cremated and her ashes rest in the Chapel of Memories Valhalla Cemetery, St. Louis County MO
