Lena Barbara Jost was born on July 18th 1889 as noted in the Missouri records of Births. She was the fifth Child and first daughter of Charles Jost and Augusta Emilie Hallbauer Jost. The family was living at 3103 Rutger in South St. Louis MO. In the 1900 Census she is listed at school so we know that she did complete some education. In the 1910 census she is listed as a shirt ironer and she worked at one time at Banner laundry. On Monday November 4 1912 she was discharged from the laundry. She and several of the other girls were unhappy with working conditions and were going to ask for changes. She was appointed first spokes women. After she spoke the others chose not to and she alone was fired. On Wednesday evening April 12 she met Tony Pointer the man she was to marry.

They were married on June 25 1913 and the Marriage license is noted in the June 26th 1913 Post Dispatch and were living on 2550 Lafayette St. In St. Louis. She had five children and most of her life was devoted to raising them. They lived in a number of places in St. Louis, Jennings and finally spending many years on Gerling Place in Overland. Lena dies in February 26 1967 after a brief illness. She was cremated and her ashes rest in the Chapel of Memories Valhalla Cemetery, St. Louis County MO
